# 'Increase beds to treat Covid patients'

Private hospitals granted special permission to up bed strength by 40 per cent

KOLKATA: West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Thursday said her government has decided to grant special permission to all medical establishments to increase the number of beds by at least 40 per cent to deal with the Covid-19 pandemic situation.

She said that private hospitals in the state have been allowed to increase the number of beds, which will enhance the total number of beds in the hospitals in West Bengal to around 30,000.

"Today we have decided to give special permission to all the hospitals to increase their bed strength by 40 per cent. The decision was taken to address the Covid-19 pandemic here," she told reporters at the state secretariat. The chief minister said that a decision was taken to set up oxygen plants at all medical and super specialty hospitals.

"The hospital authorities will be able to do it themselves. The medical colleges in the districts have been given the authority to do it themselves since doing it centrally may take some time. We do not want to waste time," she said. On the question of getting more doctors, she said third-year post graduate trainees will be employed in treating Covid-19 patients.

"Since their examinations have



been postponed they can be utilised in treating Covid-19 patients. They will get some extra benefit for this. It will help us in getting 2,000 more doctors and nurses," Banerjee added.

18,431 cases, 117 deaths

West Bengal's Covid-19 fatalities rose to 11,964 on Thursday after 117 deaths, the highest so far in a single day, were reported, the health department said in a bulletin.

The caseload also mounted to 9,35,066 after the state registered a record one-day spike of 18,431 fresh infections. In the last 24 hours, 17,412 recoveries were reported while the number of active cases increased to 1,22,774, the bulletin said.

Since Wednesday, 60,105 samples have been tested for Covid-19 in West Bengal.

## High Court orders personal appearance of K'para SP

THE Orissa High Court's vacation bench has directed the SP of Kendrapara to appear in person on May 12 over no progress in proceedings in the cases registered in connection with illegal operation of trawlers on Gahirmatha coast in the last 10 years.

The vacation bench of Chief Justice S Muralidhar and Justice BP Routray issued the direction to the SP on Wednesday to appear in virtual mode on that day to explain why effective steps have not been taken in 12 cases registered since 2011.

The bench found that the 12 cases were registered against 10 different trawlers between November 2011 and December 2020. One Niranjan Mandal was named accused in nine of the cases. While he was acquitted in one case, no progress in proceedings was made in the rest eight cases.

As evident from the affidavit submitted by the SP, the two other accused named in three other cases belonged to the same family. Both were the son of Niranjan Mandal. No progress was made in the three

cases registered against Manas Mandal and Makhan Mandal. In fact, Manas was acquitted in one case.

The affidavit was filed in pursuance of a direction by the Court on April 27 to submit a report on the present status of all the cases registered since 2011 against the prime accused and his family members who were involved in the recent attack (March 15) on a patrolling boat on Gahirmatha coast.

The vacation bench also took note of Amicus Curiae Mohit Agarwal's submission that even in the case arising out of the March 15, a case relating which had been registered at Talachua marine police station, the named accused had obtained protection from arrest in an anticipatory bail application filed in the High Court.

According to the report of the Amicus Curiae, on March 15, the patrolling team of Gahirmatha Wildlife Range and APR police personnel detected a fishing trawler in the sanctuary area. When the trawler was attempted to be intercepted, crew members of the trawler attacked the patrolling staff with sharp weapons.

### **Koraput Deputy Collector suspended in** Kalimela land scam

Malkangiri: The deputy Collector of Koraput Alok Kumar Anugulia has been suspended for his alleged role in illegal settlement of government lands in favour of 18 encroachers during his tenure as Kalimela Tehsildar. A letter issued in this regard by the Principal Secretary of Revenue and Disaster Management department on Thursday stated that Anugulia has been placed under suspension and disciplinary proceedings against him is being contemplated. Anugulia had in connivance with two other officials illegally registered large tracts of government land at Kalimela in favour of 18 encroachers in exchange for monetary favours. Subsequently, the Revenue department asked the Collector Vijay Yedulla to look into the issue on December 17 last year and submit a report within 10 days. Sub-Collector Rameshwar Pradhan verified the record of land in the block and found that Anugulia violated the norms while registering government land in

The share of RT-PCR was only 2.5 pc in Dhenkanal, 5.8 pc in Balangir and 9.3 pc in Puri. Odisha is among the 12 states, which are now contributing significantly to the national tally with a high positivity rate. As per the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, the TPR in the State was 23 pc between April 26 and May 2.

As per data compiled by ICMR, 16 states have more than 20 pc TPR and the rate in Odisha is higher than that of Kerala (22 pc), Himachal Pradesh (20 pc), Tamil Nadu (19 pc), Bihar (18 pc), Punjab (17 pc) and Jharkhand (16 pc). The alarming TPR notwithstanding, the number of overall testing and the share of RT-PCR continued to remain much lower in Odisha than many other states. Despite clear instruction from the Centre to test at least 70 pc of the samples through RT-PCR, it has never crossed 40 pc.

Apart from low testing, alleged data fudging by the Health directorate in terms of positive cases has come to fore. As per testing reports compiled by district officials of Keonjhar, as many as 287 people had tested positive on April 27. But surprisingly, the State government announced only 175 cases the next day. While the sharp fluctuation in number of cases indicates 'data management' at some level, health authorities refuted the allegations. Additional Chief Secretary of Health, PK Mohapatra said the directorate is sharing the number of cases received from the districts.

Of the 10,521 fresh cases, 5,945 were in quarantine and the rest were local infections. Khurda, Sundargarh and Cuttack registered the maximum number of new cases at 1,477, 1,186 and 963 respectively. Ten districts recorded more than 300 cases each. With this the tally rose to 5,00,162 of which 4,23,257 have recovered and the active cases stood at 74,731.

The maximum four deaths were reported from Khurda, two each from Balasore and Malkangiri and one each from Boudh, Deogarh, Jharsuguda, Keonjhar, Kalahandi, Nayagarh, Rayagada, Sambalpur and Sundargarh.

# Distressed OSCSC seeks bailout from State govt

WITH a market borrowing of ₹15,000 crore and credit rating of A minus, the Odisha State Civil Supplies Corporation (OSCSC) has urged the State government to bail it out from the financial quagmire by extending guarantee for fresh loan to ensure uninterrupted procurement of rabi paddy and smooth implementation of food security schemes.

The State-run corporation sent the SOS to the Government after several public sectors banks including UCO Bank and NABARD refused to extend more credit with State government guarantee as collateral.

The recommendation of UCO Bank's local branch for additional exposure of ₹500 crore, over and above the ₹1,700 crore working capital facility already extended, to the sanctioning authorities of the bank was turned down recently due to the unstable financial condition of the State PSU.

Echoing similar concern, NABARD, the biggest lender of ₹5,000 crore in the loan portfolio of OSCSC, refused to raise its exposure any further without government guarantee or letter of comfort. "Other lenders including the Bank of India have sounded the need for heightened comfort from collateral of government guarantee/comfort letter," the Food Supplies and Consumer

Welfare department said. The market borrowing of the corpo-

ration has hit the roof at ₹14,850 crore and it might cross ₹17,000 crore by the end of Rabi procurement of the current kharif marketing season (KMS).

If not addressed and reimbursed immediately, it will go on increasing with every passing day. Of the total market borrowing, ₹11,320.85 crore is due to interest costs amounting to ₹4,700.85 crore up to March 2021 and ₹6,620 crore for subsidy receivable from the Centre.

The stock-in-process and surplus godown stock of CMR have the combined effect of pushing OSCSC's borrowing₹ to ₹14,850 crore, said a note of the department.

While the Centre has not released the provisional subsidy for three quarters of 2020-21 financial year, food subsidy bill to the tune of ₹6,620 crore is pending till April 30, 2021 of which ₹1,547 crore pertains to 2020-21 and advance subsidy claim of ₹1,500 crore stands receivable for the first quarter of 2021-22. An amount of ₹3,573 crore food subsidy is pending from 2003-04, the note said.


The huge food subsidy bill is pending with the Centre despite repeated request by Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik and Food Supplies and Consumer Welfare Minister RP Swain to the Centre to release the amount as the State is facing funds crunch to carry out decentralised procurement of paddy.
