New College, Chennai; Dr G Sivaraman, Siddha Physician; Narthaki Nataraj, Bharatanatyam dancer; Mallika Srinivasan, MD of Tractors and Farm Equipment Limited; Dr J Amalorpavanathan, activist and retired Professor of Madras Medical College; and TR B Raja, MLA, Mannargudi.

Origin of the body

The State Planning Commission was formed by M Karunanidhi on May 25, 1971. It acted as an advisory body guiding policy coherence and launching of new programmes for the development of the State. After the Union government scrapped the planning commission, the State, in 2017, announced the formation of SDPC. In May last year, the government notified SDPC and appointed former AIADMK minister Ponnaiyan as its vice chairman. After the government change, he resigned.


